## CELEBRATING THE VIBES OF THE TRIBES

A tribe is a group of people, usually staying in jungle areas, in a small locality, absolutely illiterate poor, hardly clad in clothes, usually dark and frail, fully living within their own community, engaged in hunting and searching for roots, shoots and fruits as their veg food and roasted animals as non-veg food, resisting all efforts of development and have a strong dislike for strangers and educated modern community. Hence, It is important to preserve and promote tribal cultures and heritage in order to uplift the quality of people living in tribal areas.

## ACTIVITY I : MAGAZINE/BROCHURE

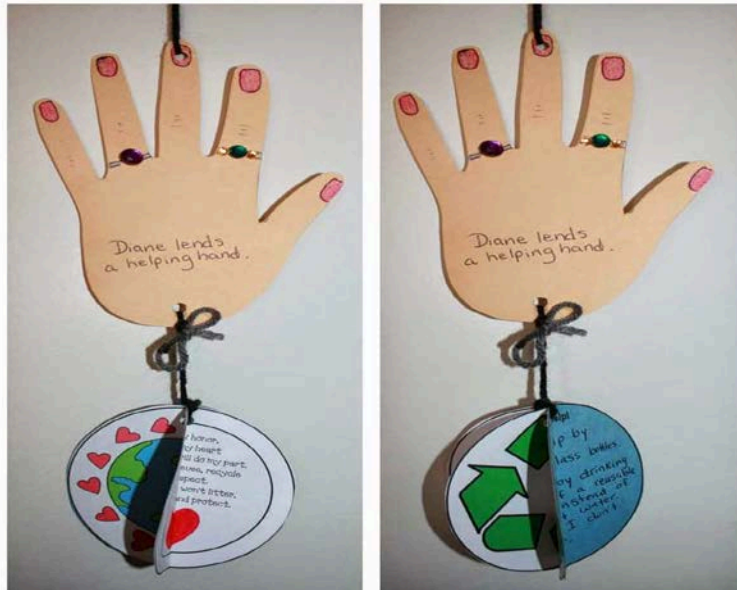

I pledge to switch to all-around exceptional light.

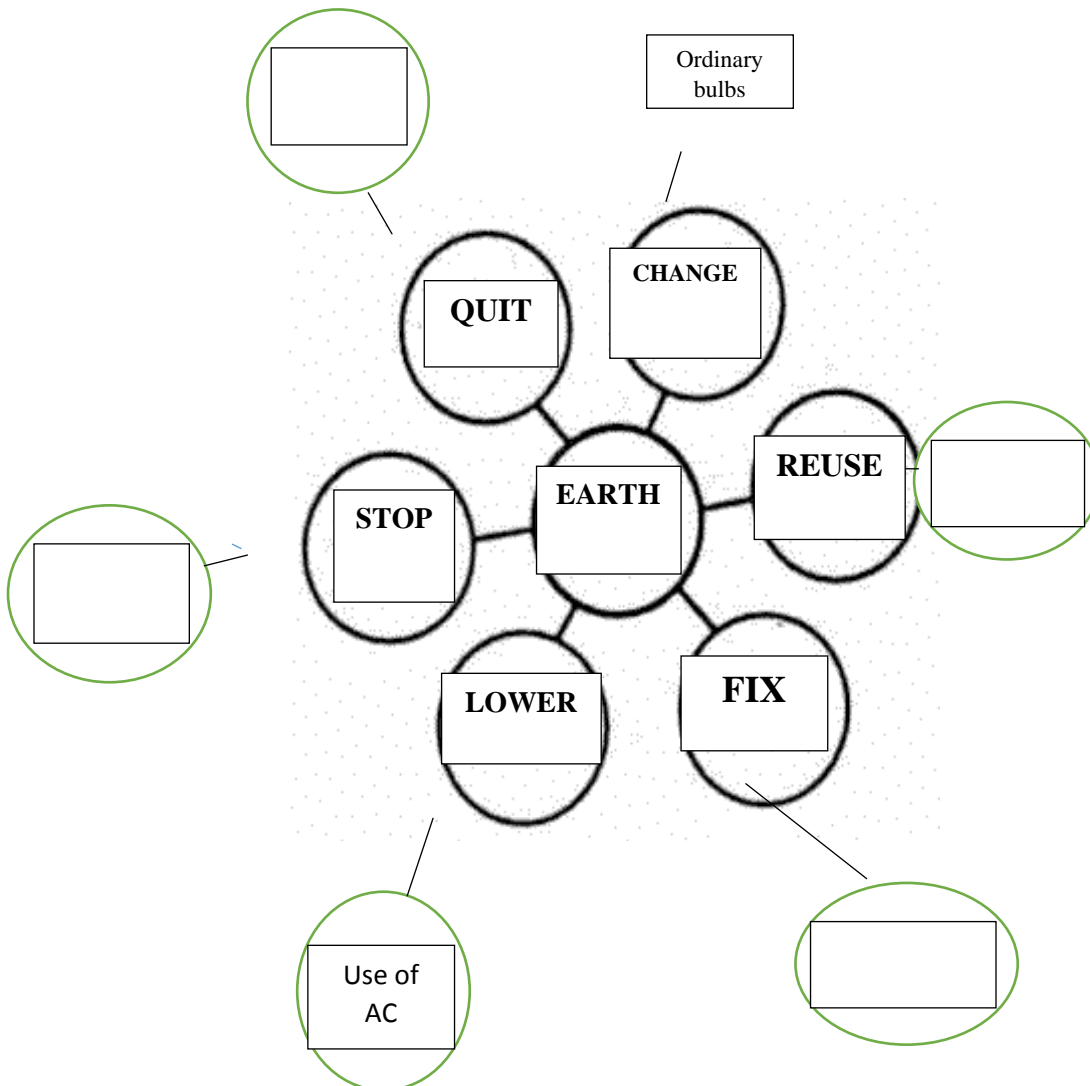
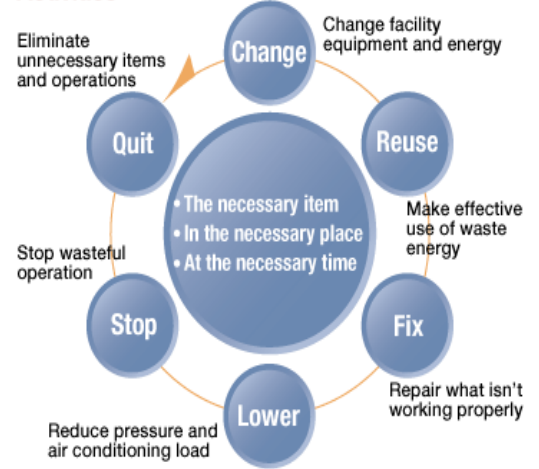
I pledge to save energy as 'Energy Saved is Energy Produced'.

- STEP IV : Extend each circle using another ice-cream stick and the circle prepared in STEP II for each perspective.

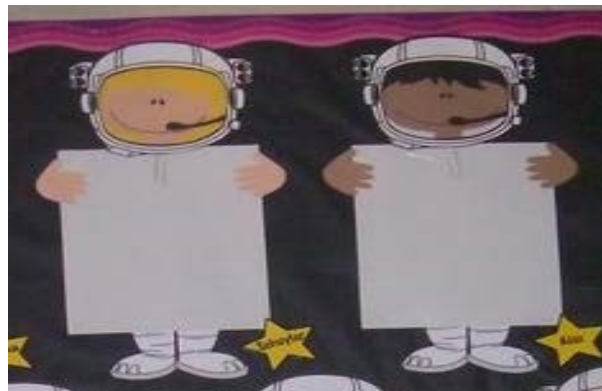
## ACTIVITY VII : MILESTONES IN THE JOURNEY OF ISRO(Indian Space and Research Organisation)

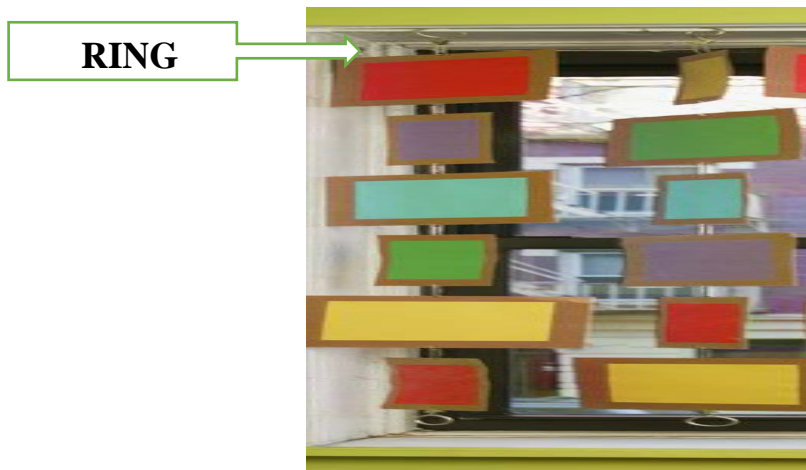




## ACTIVITY IX : INDIA GLITTERS IN THE WORLD

STEP 1: Use wedding cards or any ordinary cardboard to create 3 rectangular and 3 square shapes as shown below.



STEP 2 : Cover the base using a brown cover and then paste A4 size sheets on both the sides as shown.

STEP 3 : Take the six shapes for one field (example CWG 2018). On one side paste one or two pictures and on the other side write in brief about it.

STEP 4: Attach all the cards with a string as shown. Put a ring at the top for hanging. Similarly, make another row of cards for the second field (as per your choice).

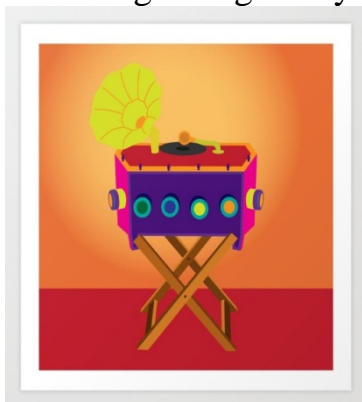
## ACTIVITY X : INDIA ON THE GO

Image of a bioscope is given below which was a craze among children decades ago. Create your own and share it with your friends.

STEP 1 : Take a big cardboard box (You can take a one used by online shopping portals for delivery.) which is opened from the top. Cover it with a sheet of your choice.

STEP 2: Collect colourful images of incredible India as shown below in terms of people, food, festivals and forms of dances. Paste these pictures inside the box on the three sides leaving one side. Also, leave the top and bottom of the box.

STEP 3 : Close the box from the top. The side on which you didn't paste the picture, make a hole big enough for you to see inside. Cover the hole with a red transparent sheet.



## ACTIVITY XI: A LEADER IN THE MAKING

India is the largest democracy in the world that allows the citizens to cast vote and elect a government of their choice. There are many political parties who nominate their representatives to contest an election. **A public declaration of policy and aims, issued before an election by a political party or the candidate is known as a manifesto.**

Imagine yourself as a young and able leader of a new political party who is keen to work towards making India a 'vishwaguru' again. Draft a manifesto for your party highlighting the plans and policies which you wish to undertake to achieve your goal.

STEP 1: Take 1/4<sup>th</sup> of a pastel sheet to **write the manifesto**. Use any ordinary cardboard available at home as its base.

STEP 2: Give a suitable name and design a symbol for your party and include it in the manifesto.

STEP 3: Make it interesting and colourful.



## ACTIVITY XII: CELEBRATING THE CONSTITUTION DAY

The Constitution of India is the longest written constitution of any sovereign country in the world. It lays down the framework defining fundamental, political principles, establishes the powers and duties of government institutions and sets out the fundamental rights, the directive principles and the duties of citizens. Every year 26<sup>th</sup> November is celebrated as the Constitution Day of India. On this occasion, design a newspaper highlighting its history, parts of the constitution, facts, the Preamble and rights and duties of children. Collect articles and pictures from the daily newspapers related to 'the Preamble' and paste them on your newspaper.

STEP 1: Take half pastel sheet of any colour and fold it from the center to give it a shape of the newspaper.

STEP 2: Now paste or write all the collected information on the pastel sheet with pictures.

STEP 3: Give your newspaper a suitable title.
