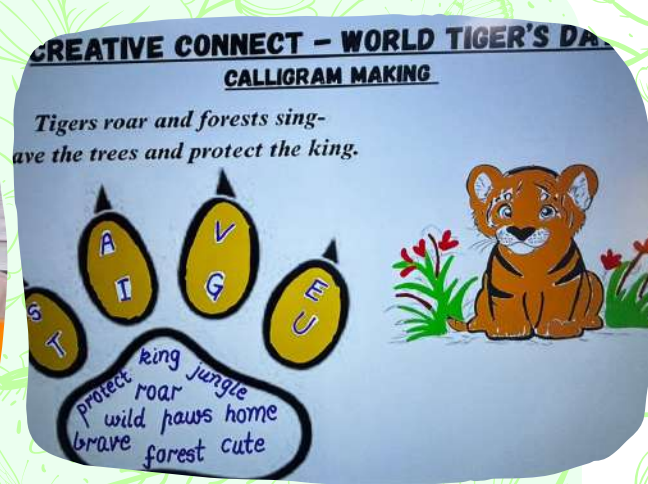
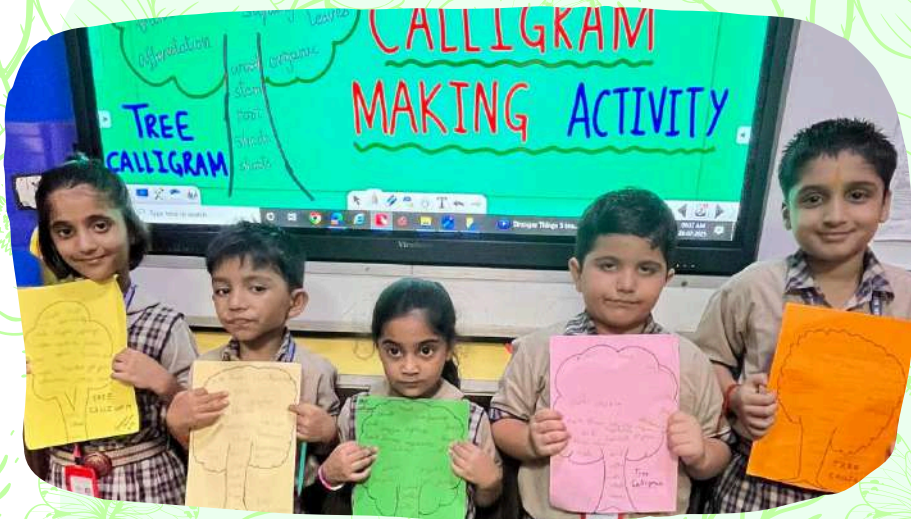
PLASTIC COLLECTION DRIVE

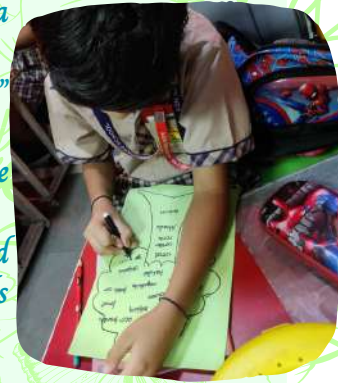
CREATIVE CONNECT – WORLD TIGER'S DAY
