Like a great teacher, Nature teaches more than she preaches. In fact, there is a lesson in every aspect of Nature, if only we care to see!

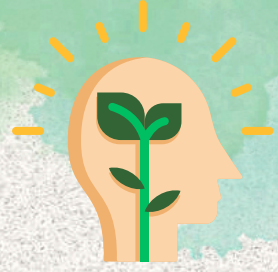

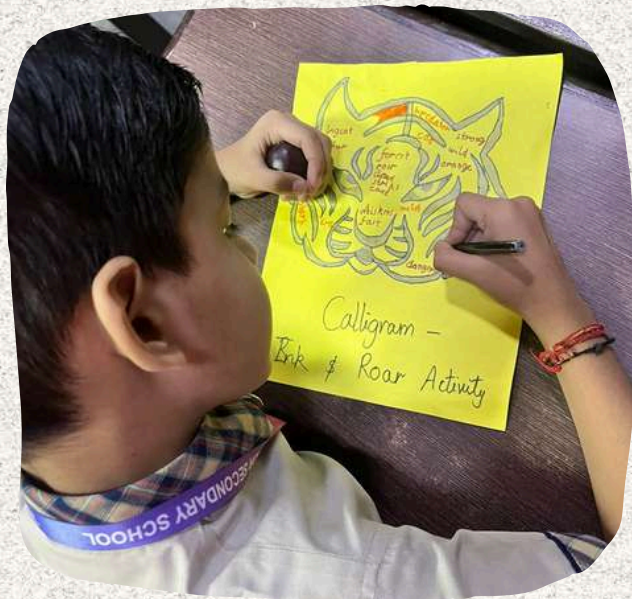
SCRAP TO CLAP
