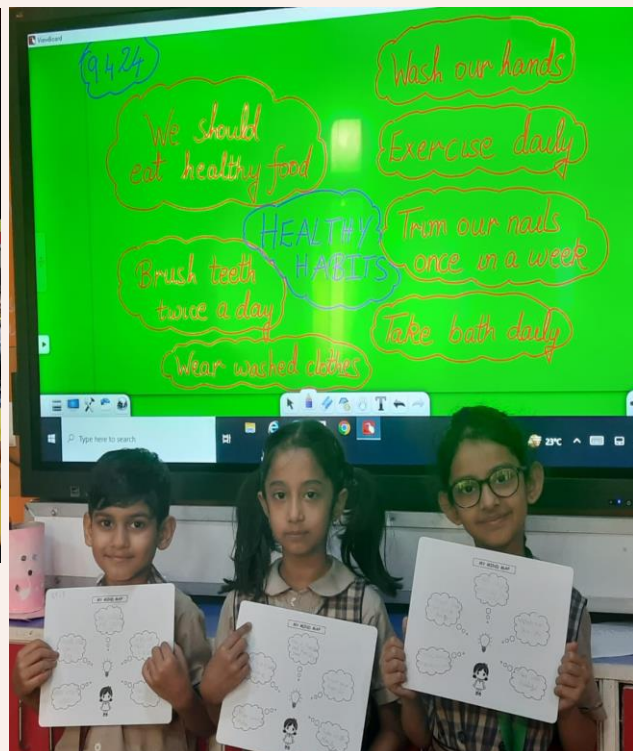


Special assemblies undoubtedly hold the top position among all routine activities in a school.

Earth Day

Students of Grade I and II of ASN Senior Secondary School conducted a vibrant **Earth Day celebration and Global Action Days**. Over the course of 10 days, students actively participated in a series of engaging activities aimed at fostering environmental stewardship and a deeper understanding of climate empowerment whilst catering to different learning styles.

Activities ranged from 'Earth Tales - Read Aloud story videos', Art for Earth projects, integrating art, language, visuals like PPTs, and reading and writing activities. From Earth Warriors Medal Making from eco-friendly material to the "Earth's Palette- Colors of Care" Coloring Competition, students explored their creativity and developed a better understanding of environmental responsibility. They enjoyed the Climate Quest game and explored and learned about various Earth Warriors and their roles in habitat restoration. Activities like Bag the Change enabled them to understand the concept of recycle and reuse where children promoted the eco friendly alternative of paper and cloth bags. They proudly created Word Bank notebooks by using left over pages of old notebooks, embodying the principles of the circular economy. Eco-Bingo Bonanza and Artistry with Bottle Caps further encouraged students to embrace the 5Rs of waste management.

As part of Plastic Patrol, students collected plastic waste, demonstrating their commitment to responsible consumption and plastic recycling. Additionally, the students brought wet waste from their home and collected waste from their food break time for the school Aerobin to make compost, reinforcing the importance of sustainable practices. During their visit to the compost site, they experienced and learned the differences between the harvested compost and wet waste.

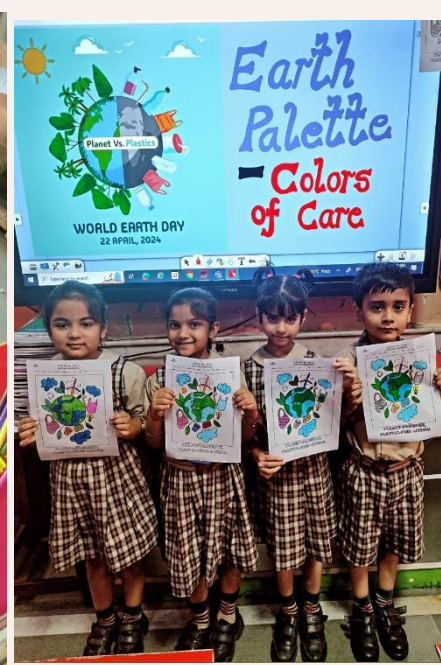
Their active participation in Global Action Days kick started the new cycle of action-oriented experiential learning and greening skill building; paving way to a new crop of climate ready learners.

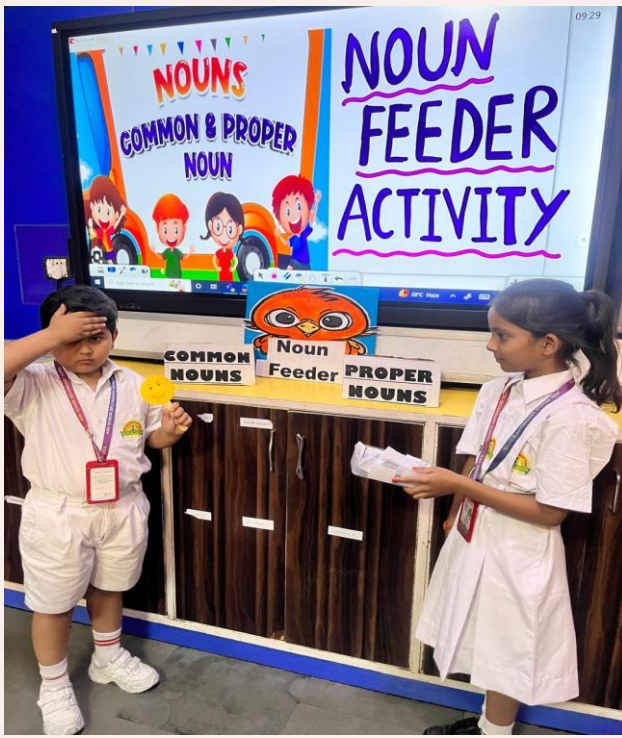

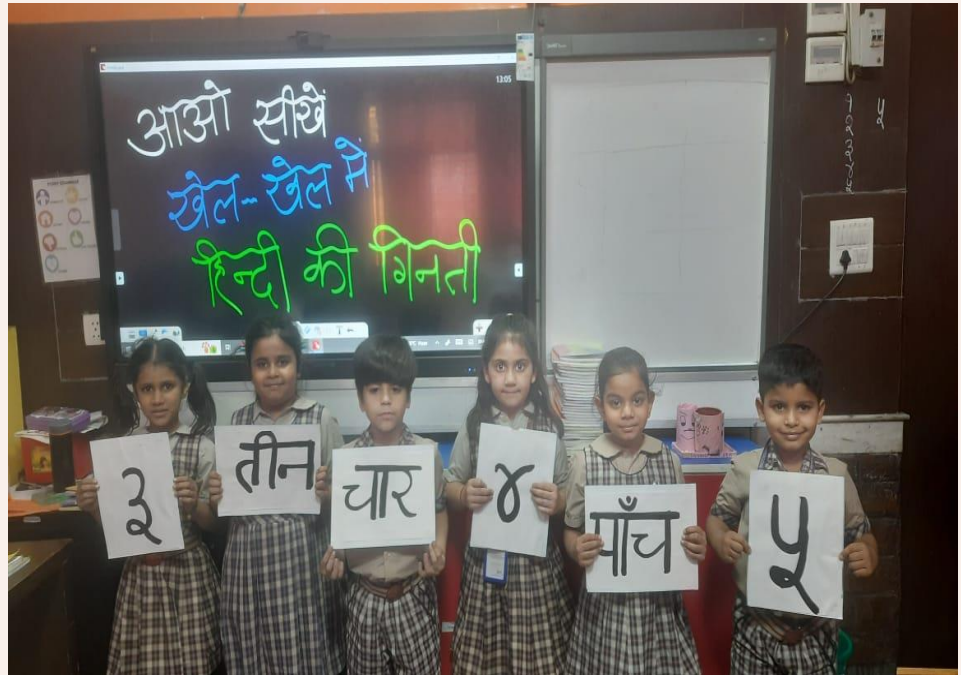

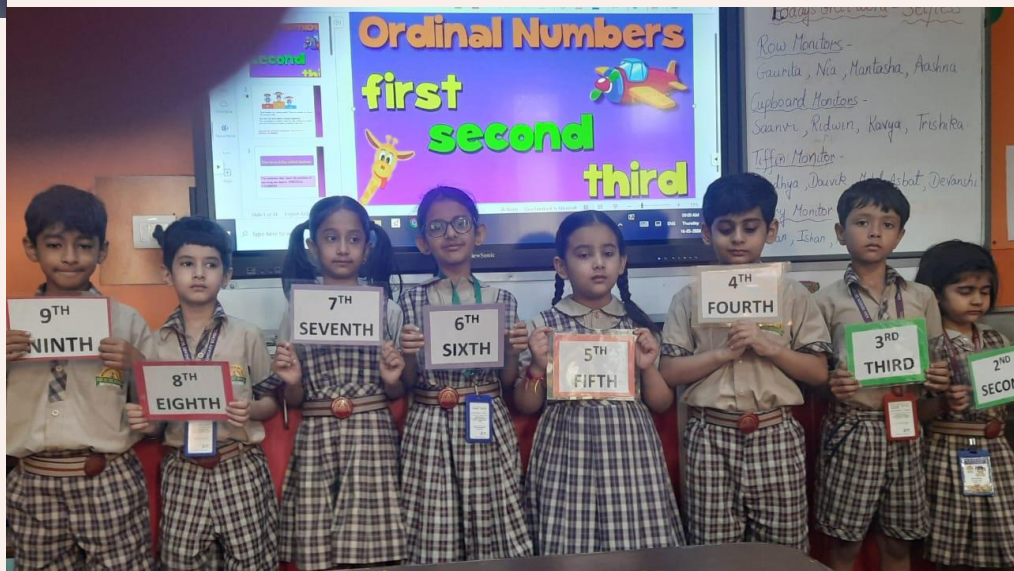
